This presentation will draw on Bruce's previous dramatherapy clinical practice with adolescents & young people who presented multiple issues around sexuality and gender (including inter-gender and transgender), early sexual abuse/early sexual activity, addictive/self-harming behaviours. The clinical practice referred to took place at 2 different projects:

- a) Over 2 years at an inner city local neighbourhood centre and theatre in Hackney, London;
- b) Over 3 years at a project for street-homeless young people of diverse gender identities and sexual orientations who were involved in sex work and/or the underground drug culture.

The presentation will look at:

- some of the contexts within which the work took place
- how these issues were presented by clients in therapy;
- various approaches adopted within therapy process;
- the particular transference and counter-transference dynamics involved in these specific client/therapist dynamic;
- include as far as possible some opportunity for experiential exercises as well as time for reflection.
